Kristina Costa is the Managing Director for Policy and Strategic Engagement at the University of Chicago Institute for Climate and Sustainable Growth. She served until January 2025 as Deputy Assistant to the President and Director of the Office of Clean Energy Innovation and Implementation in the Biden White House, where she was responsible for managing the successful implementation of the clean energy and climate provisions of the Inflation Reduction Act. Costa managed a lean White House team and an interagency process that issued guidance on 23 clean energy tax provisions, obligated more than \$98 billion in federal grants, and spurred more than \$450 billion in private-sector clean energy investment. Prior to her White House role, Costa was senior advisor and speechwriter to Deputy Secretary of State Wendy Sherman. She also served in the Obama White House, on the 2016 Hillary Clinton campaign, and in the United States Senate, and has worked at the Center for American Progress and Fenway Strategies. Costa is a graduate of Wellesley College and the McCourt School for Public Policy at Georgetown University, where she was a McCourt Scholar.
